## ***LEAF COLLECTION INFORMATION FOR RESIDENTS THAT LIVE OUTSIDE THE CITY LIMITS BUT WITHIN THE DISTRICT***

Richmond Sanitary District will be collecting leaves for **our residents who live outside the city limits but within the District.** We will begin the week of October 19, 2015. The areas that we will cover will be as follows:

All of JFK area, SW M Street, Sycamore Lane, Walnut Lane, Toschlog Road, Spring Grove, Fairacres, all of West Chester area, Tingler Road, Martin Road, Arba Pike, East Highland Road, East Chester Road, all of Forest Pine Estates and Forest Glen Estates, Straightline Pike, Smith Lane, all of Rose Hamilton area, Salisbury Road, Samuel Drive and Airport Road

Your leaves should be raked into the roadway approximately three feet from the curb or edge of the road where possible. In areas that have little or no curb lane, the leaves should be raked to the very edge of the curb or roadway. The leaf piles should be no higher than two feet so that the vision of drivers will not be obstructed and to make leaf pick-ups more efficient.

Residents who live on U.S. 27, U.S. 40 and S.R. 227 South (Boston Pike) must bag their leaves and call for a special pick up, which will be done on Mondays. Residents are limited to ten 30-gallon bags of leaves a week. Richmond Sanitary District will not pick up leaves in your weekly trash collection.

Your leaves should be raked into the roadway approximately two feet from the curb or edge of the road where possible, and away from vehicles.

Leaves will be collected approximately once every 13 days, weather permitting.

Only leaves are to be put in the piles. Absolutely no grass clippings, limbs, garden waste, shrubs, flowers, etc.

The leaf piles should be no higher than two feet so that the vision of drivers will not be obstructed and to make leaf pick-ups more efficient.
